
Business & Human Rights – Sobering Facts

- Ongoing research is showing, there isn't a single business world-wide who can say their operations & supply chain are free of risk of Human Rights Infringements. Infringements are on the rise globally.
- **Human Rights Infringements** include excessive working hours; the under-payment or non-payment of wages; non-payment of overtime; poor health & safety.
- Modern Slavery is the term used to describe slavery, labour exploitation, forced labour and human trafficking. The Global Slavery Index estimates 40.3 million people worldwide are trapped in modern slavery c. 8000 in Ireland.
- High-Risk Sectors include Agriculture, Construction, Apparel (e.g. Uniforms & T-Shirts); industries that use raw materials for component parts; Facilities
 Management (particularly the use of Recruitment Agencies by Sub-Contractors) e.g. Cleaning, Security, Maintenance, Catering & Food such as the sourcing of fresh produce, fruit & vegetables, meat & fish.
- Migrant Workers and Refugees are particularly vulnerable to Debt Bondage

- 3. Does your organisation have a human rights or modern slavery policy?
- 4. What steps are being taken to raise awareness and engage staff and suppliers on human rights risks and modern slavery?
